Volunteer of the Month



Elsie McCCasey, the 'Volunteer of the Month' for January, can be described in handyman terms as someone "who does a little bit of everything" at the Howell Senior Center. Elsie's first exposure to the Center was as a member of the Young at Hearts group that meets there regularly. "I helped in the kitchen," she noted.

Once she became a volunteer for the Center and the Howell Parks & Recreation Department, her opportunities to pitch in and help expanded. "We do a lot of different things," she said, "For example during Melon Fest we fold shirts. Recently, the Center had a fundraiser at the Big Boy restaurant. We were celebrity waitresses and hostesses and also cleaned up the tables. A portion of the proceeds that night came back to the Center. It was a lot of fun; I had a ball. And we did pretty good raising money." Mrs. McCCasey is a native of Livingston County. Born in Deerfield Center in August of 1935, the youngest of Frank and Gladys Howe's three children, her early years were spent living on various farms. "My father hired out, and he worked at several different places. I was 10 years old when my parents bought a house in the Hartland area. We lived in the country with enough acreage so my dad could have

a garden. He got into road construction and ended up doing that for many years. He did a lot of traveling. My mother was a homemaker."

Elsie graduated from Hartland High School in 1953, worked for Citizens Insurance for a couple of years, tried some other jobs, then moved to Ann Arbor and did office work at the University of Michigan. "I did that for about two years until my marriage to Thomas McCCasey in 1959, she said. "I had known him during high school, but we met again in Ann Arbor. He was working there for Michigan Bell."

The newlyweds lived briefly in Ann Arbor, but then purchased a home in the Brighton. They later moved to Howell and their three children graduated from school here. "When the kids got to high school I went back to work," she said. "I had an office position with the intermediate school district for eight years."

Her husband's worked eventually took them to Reed City where they lived for about five years. "We stayed busy there," she noted. "We joined a square dance group and I learned to cross country ski."

They then moved to Ionia after Thomas took an early retirement due to health problems. "Our children were grown, and we had one in Grand Rapids and the others in Howell, so that city was closer than being up north. We bought a big farm. I did volunteer work, teaching English to migrant workers. I stayed in Ionia until my husband passed away in 2004."

She relocated back to Livingston County and now resides in a home between Howell and Brighton. Her oldest daughter, Tracey, still lives in Grand Rapids, while daughter Janice and Daniel are in the Howell area. She has five grandsons and says being around them is her "favorite hobby." Traveling to different Michigan venues with the trips offered by the Senior Center is another enjoyable pastime, and she spends about a month in Florida when she visits her sister-in-law.

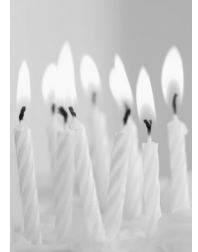
